**Date Report Received:** April 2nd, 2008 (due September 30th, 2007)  
**Grant #:** 257 **Title:** Investigation of Predictors of Outcome for Canine Mast Cell Tumors  
**Principal Investigator:** Elizabeth M. Whitley, DVM, PhD  
**Research Institute:** Auburn University

**Performance Summary:** Data for objectives 1 and 2 are still being collected and they have not been analyzed. For the 92 samples, the histopathology is complete and the immunohistochemical staining is complete but not analyzed. 71 tissue sections have been stained for AgNOR but not fully analyzed. The data has not been compiled and analyzed for correlation. Objective 3 is complete but true cell lines were not able to be obtained. The PI has been contacted to determine the schedule for completion of this study and to obtain an explanation for the delay so far. The conditional letter to the PI is available.

**Objectives completed:** 1 of 3. Objective #1: To determine if there is a relationship between canine MCT patient response to treatment and expression of members of a panel of biological markers. Objective #2: To examine biopsy tissues from current, in -coming canine MCT cases for the expression of the panel of biological markers in Objective 1 and identify correlating clinical parameters or response to treatment. Objective #3: To develop and characterize in vitro cell line cultures of MCTs from dogs in Objective 2 with metastatic and non-metastatic mast cell tumors. 100% Complete.

**Significant Accomplishments:** Developed a protocol to culture neoplastic canine mast cell cells long-term in vitro (but did not develop an immortalized cell line). It was determined the addition of heparin to the culture is essential for tissue culture survival.



**Date Report Received:** May 7th, 2008  
**Grant #:** 642 **Title:** Investigation of the Genetic Mutations Underlying Progressive Retinal Atrophy  
**Principal Investigator:** Simon Petersen-Jones, DVM, PhD, DECVO  
**Research Institute:** Michigan State University

**Performance Summary:** 32 of 60 candidate genes have been analyzed. Unfortunately, none have provided a promising correlation. SNP microarray analysis has been performed on Italian Greyhounds has identified 3 chromosome locations of interest which resulted 5 candidate genes. Additional SNP analysis is being performed.

**Objectives completed:** 0 of 4. Objective #1: To continue to collect DNA samples from PRA-affected dogs and their relatives from several different breeds so that we can screen candidate gene loci in each of the breeds. Objective #2: To identify polymorphic markers in 60 additional candidate genes for PRA. Objective #3: To use the markers to investigate whether any of our chosen candidate gene loci are linked to PRA in any of the breeds from which we have received samples. Objective #4: To continue investigation of linked loci to identify causal gene mutations.

**Significant Accomplishments:** None.



**Date Report Received:** February 11th, 2008 (due March 31st, 2008)  
**Grant #:** 632 **Title:** MicroRNAs and Canine Lymphoma  
**Principal Investigator:** William C. Kisseberth, DVM, PhD  
**Research Institute:** Ohio State University

**Performance Summary:** The grant has been extended by a year but with significant results. They have been able to develop a canine miRNA array containing 680 miRNA probes + controls. This is the first miRNA array for canines. The team has successfully collaborated with multiple departments throughout the veterinary school and the entire university. They are being very diligent in validating the array to ensure a high quality product. The PI has not begun analyzing the lymphoma samples but once the array is fully validated, they should complete this task within 6 months. In the meantime, additional samples are being collected.

**Objectives completed:** 0 of 2. Objective #1: Identify canine miRNAs and characterize their expression in canine tissues. 90% COMPLETE. Objective #2: Determine the miRNA expression profiles of canine lymphomas using a modified custom oligonucleotide mircoRNA microarray. 30% COMPLETE.

**Significant Accomplishments:** \* Created a miRNA array containing 680 probes. The thorough validation of the array is nearing completion. \* There are very exciting and significant miRNA profile differences between tissue types.



**Date Report Received:** March 23rd, 2008 (due March 31st, 2008)  
**Grant #:** 615A-T **Title:** Heritable and Sporadic Genetic Lesions in Canine Lymphoma  
**Principal Investigator:** Jaime Modiano, VDM, PhD  
**Research Institute:** University of Minnesota

**Performance Summary:** Since the last progress report, the laboratory moved. Not only did the study shut down for 3 months to pack, move and unpack, there are also concerns about the integrity of the samples. The samples which are stored at -80°C may have reached -40°C. Data is still being collected and analyzed so there are not confirmed results. Additional samples need to be collected to increase the sample size and to cover all categories.

**Objectives completed:** Objective #3: Test the hypothesis that, in addition to reduced expression of genes mapping to chromosome 14 (CFA 14) in high-grade B-cell NHL and to CFA 15 and 36 in high-grade T-cell NHL, there will be tumor and breed specific gene expression signatures that will allow stratification of samples into pathogenetically significant groups. 60% COMPLETE. Objective #4: Refine tumor and breed-specific gene expression signatures using custom targeted arrays to identify the minimum number of genes that have predictive and prognostic value, and that will begin to pinpoint pathways that define breed specific risk. 30% COMPLETE.

**Significant Accomplishments:** \* Preliminary data validates the hypothesis that there is a segregation of distinct phenotypes and grades of tumors. \* Preliminary data supports the notion that there are breed-specific differences in the age of onset for lymphoma.



**Date Report Received:** February 26th, 2008 (due February 28th, 2008)  
**Grant #:** 1003-A **Title:** Variation in Thyroid Hormone Concentration and Thyroglobulin Autoantibody Status with Stage of the Canine Estrous Cycle  
**Principal Investigator:** Rebecca L. Davies, PhD  
**Research Institute:** University of Minnesota

**Performance Summary:** The study was delayed because the IACUC paperwork needed to be approved by the University of Minnesota. The investigator is not at fault for this delay. The investigator is now enrolling patients but the schedule is controlled by the dog's estrous cycle. I predict a NCE will be needed to complete sample collection from the patients.

**Objectives completed:** 0 of 2. Objective #1: To determine thyroid profile data (concentration of FT4, T4, TSH, and presence of TgAA) at specific times (anestrus, Day 5, 10 and 20 based on day 0 being onset of proestrus) of the canine estrous cycle. Objective #2: To examine potential associations between thyroid hormone profiles and reproductive status.

**Significant Accomplishments:** None.

**Date Report Received:** February 27th, 2008 (due February 28th, 2008)  
**Grant #:** 906A **Title:** Development of Pharmacogenetic Markers for Refractoriness to Phenobarbital in Treatment of Canine Epilepsy  
**Principal Investigator:** Greg Gibson, PhD  
**Research Institute:** North Carolina State University

**Performance Summary:** After six months of this study, nearly all of the samples have been collected and are currently being processed. The project will require significant data analysis. It is foreseen that a no-cost extension may be needed to fully evaluate all of the data.

**Objectives completed:** Objective #1: Replicate the preliminary findings with an extended sample of 150 refractory and 150 responsive epileptic dogs using our custom Illumina Sentrix Genotyping BeadArray to evaluate associations between 384 single nucleotide polymorphisms (SNPs) and response to Phenobarbital. Objective #2: Evaluate the effects of population (breed structure) and linkage disequilibrium on the significance and magnitude of effects of associated SNPs with the inclusion of 100 normal dogs in our sample size.

**Significant Accomplishments:** No specific results have been determined at this time.



**Date Report Received:** February 25th, 2008 (due February 28th, 2008)  
**Grant #:** 1031-A **Title:** Determination of Target Antigens in Canine Primary Immune-Mediated Hemolytic Anemia  
**Principal Investigator:** Darren Wood, DVM, DVSc, DACVP  
**Research Institute:** University of Guelph

**Performance Summary:** The investigator ran into difficulties with the protocols for the PAGE. Non-denaturing conditions were needed which adds complexity to the methods. The PI has optimized the protocol and added additional controls. It is good that the PI added the additional controls which illustrated the deficiencies in the denatured gels. The RBC samples need to be analyzed again under these new conditions.

**Objectives completed:** 0 of 2. Objective #1: Characterize canine RBC membrane proteins from a pool of healthy dogs using 1 dimension SDS-polyacrylamide gel electrophoresis (1D SDS-PAGE) as well as 2 dimension gel electrophoresis (2D PAGE). 50% COMPLETE. Objective #2: Elucidate RBC membrane antigens that are targeted by the immune system in dogs diagnosed with primary IMHA, by looking at the specificities of antibodies found in patients with active disease. 50% COMPLETE.

**Significant Accomplishments:** Developed the protocol for a native PAGE of erythrocyte membrane proteins.

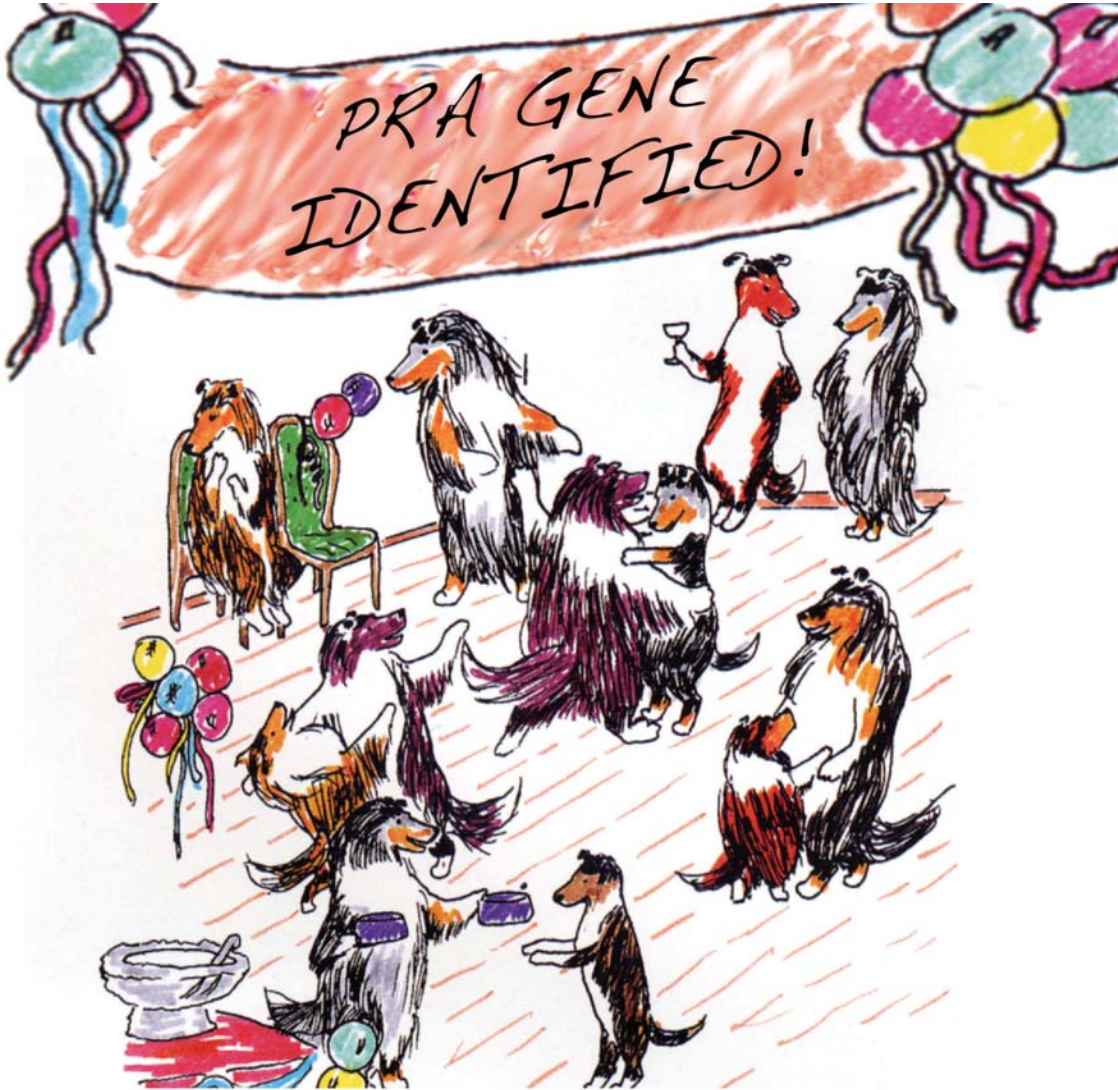

to Collie owners and breeders in the immediate future.

"Believe me, I never expected that this research would take so long or have so many unpredictable twists and turns. I am extremely grateful for the support and cooperation that so many Collie breeders, owners, and organizations, particularly the Collie Health Foundation, have steadfastly provided over the years.

## ***CVM Update***

### **COMFORTIS® AND IVERMECTIN INTERACTION SAFETY WARNING NOTIFICATION**

Today the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) Center for Veterinary Medicine (CVM) is announcing that it has received reports of adverse reactions in dogs receiving the drug Comfortis® (spinosad) concurrently with high, extra-label doses of the drug ivermectin. The clinical signs of these adverse reactions are consistent with ivermectin toxicity.

Comfortis® (spinosad), manufactured by Elanco Animal Health, a division of Eli Lilly and Company, is a monthly oral, chewable tablet used for the prevention and treatment of flea infestations on dogs. Veterinarians who use high, extra-label doses of ivermectin to treat dogs with non-responsive demodectic mange and other conditions should be aware that some dogs have developed signs of ivermectin toxicity when ivermectin is used concurrently with Comfortis® (spinosad).

CVM and Elanco Animal Health are advising veterinarians that dogs receiving extra-label doses of ivermectin should not receive concurrent treatment with Comfortis® (spinosad).

CVM is working with Elanco Animal Health as they address this issue. Additional information regarding this safety warning can be obtained on the Elanco Animal Health website.
